Active Participation of Students in Curricular and Co-curricular during Pandemic

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The School Context

Zilla Parishad High School is a government Co-ed. school located in Karimnagar district of state Telangana. This school is situated in a rural area.

Challenges faced due to School Closure

Due to covid 19, schools in rural areas faced many challenges and so did Zilla Parishad High School. As students were not able to attend physical classes, online classes were arranged. But, since most of the students belonging to poor families, they couldn't access digital or virtual classes. They did not have smartphones, computers, laptops or internet connectivity. Because of this, their studies have been badly affected during lockdown. Academic learning of students became a cause of concern for parents.

Innovative Leadership Practices for mitigating learning gaps

To ensure teaching-learning doesn't stop, teachers of the school planned to start teaching by using their parents' mobile and created a 'WhatsApp' group for each class through which academic content like videos of lessons, important topics, online Google form for testing their learning and non-academic content like stories, puzzles, quiz and online competitions was shared. Useful academic links were shared with students and students were encouraged to participate in Online quizzes, grand tests for SSC students, and many competitions.

Apart from academic content, awareness sessions were also conducted online with students. Students attended many online sessions in the evening as well like the Handwashing Awareness program.

Career options for SSC students participated in Satya Bharti skill fest and a 4-day Kutuhal Science Camp. Students also participated in many online competitions at National, State, District, and Block levels like BRIC math, World Environment Day, World Earth Day, Rang de veer, Aathmanirbhar Bharath, International yoga day, Padya patanam, National sports day

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Headmaster and teachers of the school made sure that all students should be connected to every subject teacher and prepared a timetable and also updated all class 'WhatsApp' groups and started sharing academic worksheets and previous class worksheets on some important topics. They talked with parents and enquired about students' well-being and studies. Each teacher adopted some students and took the responsibility of calling them and sending online TV classes schedule every day and monitoring that they watch regularly and also completing the worksheets in time. Learning was also ensured by preparing a quiz in all subjects using Google form and Google classroom and feedback was sent to them. All teachers also supported children in clearing their queries
