

Types of School:




Demographic representation student and gender:

Currently total 1608 students are studying in class 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th. There are male students 1308 and 300 girls.

Social categories of students in school:



The representation of students from different social categories as enrolled that is out of total 1608 from ST -225, SC-138, BC-912, Muslim-211 and General-127.



Economic background of students:

Majority of the people of this area are involved in agriculture, daily worker and connected with small business. Total five hundred sixty three students participated in the survey 169 students responded that their parents associated as daily wager, 252 students mentioned farmer , 111 businessman , 27 in company and 4 students responded that their parents are in govt. job.
