

The board result of previous three consecutive years reflected that there is certain improvement found in the board examination. If we look into the performance of Class X board examination it was 72 percentage (%) in the year 2019-20 which became 94 percentage (%) in the year 2020-21 and it reached upto 100 percentage (%) in the year 2021-22. As per Class XII students performances in their board examination is concerned it was 48.35 percentage (%) in the year 2019-20, followed by 96.38 percentage (%) jump in the year 2020-21 and reached upto 100 percantage (%) in the year 2021-22. Where the students of Class X and XII performed better in every passing year that is from 2019 to 2021-22.

The stream wise performance of Board Result of the Arts, Commerce and Science reflects that out of 100 percentage in all the streams the 19 Arts students secured first division rank where the topper of the batch

- 5) To improve the pass percentage of the school.

6) No community participation initiatives has been found in developing and enhancing the school in better level.

7) Students who are staying at the far flung are not getting proper transportation facilities to attend their

classes regularly.

8) Some of the students are also facing difficulties in understanding the Hindi subject.

Future plan of the School

1) The undersigned along with staffs are planning to minimize the enrollment rate of the students from coming session to maintain the enrolment norm and ratio of the government so that we can increase

the pass percentage and better disciplinary action of the students.

2) The school also planned to conduct extra classes for students who is or are weak in certain subjects.

3) Planning to impart better career counseling and guidance for the students who have interested on

NTSE, JEE, NEERIST and other entrance examination.

4) To conduct occasional parents-teachers, students and School Management Committee (SMC)

interaction programme to enhance school's over all performances.

5) To prepare the students and conduct mock-sample paper test to improve their relevance skills and

knowledge to face board examination and achieve 100 percent result.

6) To prepared and trained the students to take active participation in games, sports and extra-curricular

activities and events.

7) To bestowed the moral and ethical values in the mind of the students' at best possible manner.
