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Abstract

The school in the East Khasi Hill District of Meghalaya, once considered underprivileged with zero student enrollment before the COVID-19 lockdown, underwent a remarkable transformation. After the lockdown, it welcomed 111 students and introduced several activities, including a student's kitchen garden for providing mid-day meals to children. These developments were unprecedented for the school and culminated in the recent recognition of winning a state-level competition for the World No Tobacco Day Rally and Signature Campaign in 2023.

1. About the School

Dienglieng Government Lower Primary School, established in 1949, stands as one of the oldest educational institutions. Situated in a rural area, it operates under the management of the Department of Education, Government of Meghalaya. The school offers instruction in both Khasi and English, catering to students from pre-primary to primary (Class I to V). It is affiliated with the Meghalaya Board of School Education and occupies a modest building with three classrooms accommodating all mentioned classes. At the helm of the institution is Smt. Darimeka Suchiang, a highly qualified academician with a Master's degree in Science (M.Sc.), Bachelor of Education (B. Ed.), and MTET (Meghalaya Teachers Eligibility Test) credentials. The school's faculty consists of three teachers, including two female assistant teachers. The student body comprises students from pre-primary to Class V, with a total enrollment of 111 students."



2. Location of the School

Dienglieng Government Lower Primary School, located in Dienglieng within the Mawkynrew Block of East Khasi Hills, Meghalaya, is an inclusive institution catering to preprimary and primary education for both boys and girls. The school is approximately 60 kilometers away from Shillong, and the quickest route to reach it is via the Jongksha-Mawkynrew road, which spans around 40 kilometers."



3. About Meghalaya

Shillong, the capital of Meghalaya and the administrative hub of the East Khasi Hills District in North-Eastern India, is often referred to as the "Scotland of the East." This charming city is renowned for its tourism attractions, including Umiam Lake, Shillong Golf Course, Wards Lake, Ka Phan Nonglait Park, Shillong Peak, State Museum, Don Bosco Museum, and numerous others. Beyond the city, the region boasts captivating tourist destinations like Sohra, located 50 kilometers away, celebrated worldwide for its breathtaking landscapes. During the monsoon season, when rainfall reaches its zenith at these higher altitudes, hundreds of thousands of visitors from across India, and thousands from abroad, flock to this remarkable place to experience its natural beauty.



4. Leading Innovations

4.1 Student's Enrollment

Once an inactive school with zero enrollment in 2019 before the COVID-19 lockdown, this institution saw a significant transformation over the subsequent years. In 2020, the school

welcomed its first two students, and by the end of 2021, the enrollment had increased to 35 students. The momentum continued into 2022, as word spread throughout the village about the positive changes in the school, resulting in a boost to enrollment with a total of 99 students. By 2023, the school's enrollment reached an impressive 111 students. This remarkable turnaround has positioned it as one of the most active government primary schools in the entire block, having evolved from zero enrollment to 111 students.

4.2 Student's Uniform

As seen in Fig. 1, a notable observation is the absence of school uniforms among the students. This trend persisted from 2019 through 2021, with students consistently attending school in civilian clothing. However, in 2022, after corresponding with the higher authorities and referencing data from the Unified District Information System for Education (UDISE), the school successfully secured a grant from the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) to provide

uniforms for its students. This marked a significant milestone as it was the first time in the school's history that students had access to proper school uniforms, enhancing both their sense of identity and the overall school environment.

4.3 Student's Book

Back then, from 2019 onwards, the schoolchildren faced a significant challenge as they lacked the necessary books for reading and writing. This situation persisted for several years, impacting their access to quality education. However, in the year 2022, the school took proactive steps by submitting a formal request to the higher authorities, highlighting the issue. This request was based on the data and information obtained from the Unified District Information System for Education (UDISE), which provided crucial insights into the school's needs. In response to this plea, the school was granted funding from the Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA) specifically allocated for school textbooks. This marked a turning point, as it was the first time in several years that the students had access to the necessary educational materials, greatly enhancing their learning experience and educational prospects.

5. School Activities

There are many diverse activities in which the school actively participates throughout the academic year. These initiatives encompass a wide range of events and celebrations, reflecting the school's commitment to holistic education and community engagement. These activities include Children's Day, dedicated to celebrating the children's and their potential; Tobacco-Free Education Institution Day, promoting a healthy and smoke-free learning

environment; the Mid-Day Meal program, ensuring nutritious meals for students; a joyful Christmas party to foster a sense of togetherness and celebration; engaging in various social work initiatives to contribute to the betterment of the community; Environment Day, emphasizing the importance of ecological stewardship; the Annual Sports Day to nurture physical fitness and sportsmanship; the School Creative Week, encouraging students' artistic expression and creativity; Poshan Maah, promoting nutrition and health awareness; the No Tobacco Rally and Signature Campaign, advocating against tobacco use; and, finally, the Independent Day celebration, marking the nation's freedom and unity. These activities collectively reflect the school's dedication to well-rounded education and community involvement.

5.1 Children's Day

Children's Day, a cherished day on their calendar, is dedicated to celebrating the children's innocence, creativity, and their limitless potential, reminding us of the importance of nurturing and safeguarding their dreams and aspirations. 8. Challenges for the School

The school faces a multitude of challenges, including poor infrastructure, a shortage of adequate rooms for the teaching and learning process, a limited number of teachers, insufficient teaching materials, a lack of government funding, no access to clean water supply, absence of electricity for e-learning, and an absence of a playground for children to

play in, compounded by the lack of proper fencing for ensuring their safety during school hours.

9. Conclusion

Thus, we can see that there has been a significant transformation in the school, transitioning from having no student enrollments to a remarkable 111 enrollees. The newly appointed teachers have worked tirelessly, with special commendation to the Head of School, Smt. Darimeka Suchiang, who has taken school leadership as a pivotal step in the school's transformative journey.
